Getting back into the habit!

or some people it's been very hard to keep in contact with church during this last year. I know that streaming our services has been helpful for many, and some of you have joined in our online talks and discussion groups enthusiastically. But for others, the loss of a regular routine has difficulties. Please remember that the chapel is now open again and that the Divine Liturgy and other services are being conducted as normal. Although face masks must still be warn for anyone without an exemption, just as in shops, our experience of the numbers means that if you come to church there will be a place for you.

This is particularly important for the children of our parish. Parents should think seriously about getting them back into the habit of visiting the church on Sundays, and receiving the Holy Gifts. Remember: children under 11 do not need to wear a mask in church.

I know that many of our younger families live some distance from York. Coming here on Sundays, even occasionally, is challenging, but as the Spring and Summer weather improves (at least by British standards!) think about the blessing for your children, and for you, in being able to have communion once more.

Although we can now provide Sunday School colouring and question sheets please make sure you bring pencil/pens with you, and any books they use, because we are still not permitted to share those things. Thank you.

Practical Tip

Having problems with your prayer life? Remember the word of Elder Macarius of Optina.

"Pray Simply. Do not expect to find in your heart any remarkable gift of prayer Consider yourself unworthy of it-then you will find peace. Use the empty, cold dryness of your prayer as food for your humility. Repeat constantly: "I am not worthy, Lord, I am not worthy!" But say it calmly, without agitation. This humble prayer will be acceptable to God."
